CDF ENGINE - MODEL 14

<u>USE</u>

CDF moved to the four-wheel drive Model 14 in 1990. At this point, the Department had adopted the 500 gallons per minute, two-stage pump, hydrostatically driven, as an effective system. Field experience had proven this combination to provide flexibility in dealing with the wide variety of fire scene conditions encountered by CDF crews. This design factor facilitated moving the crew inside for safety, without increasing the chassis wheel base. One note, CDF Model 14 and 15 engines are basically the same, with the exception of the chassis, four-wheel drive versus two-wheel drive.


